


Contrast and Comparison of the Judgment of Nations and Great White Throne Judgment



Characteristic of Judgment	Judgment of Nations	Great White Throne
Scripture Passage	Matthew 25:31-46	Revelation 20:11-15
Time of Judgment	Premillennial	Postmillennial
Place of Judgment	The Earth, probably Jerusalem or the Battle at Megiddo	Heaven or some place between Heaven and Earth
Subject of Judgment	Living Gentiles (Note: it is a misnomer to say these are “nations” like the USA, Russia, or China, but rather nations “ethnos” is a technical term for “non-Jews”. In other words, the Gentiles – some are lost – “goats” and some are saved “sheep”.	The dead of all ages – both Jews and Gentiles – these are all unsaved. (All the Christian dead are raised in the Rapture, the Old Testament and Tribulation Saints are raised at the beginning of the Millennial Kingdom, hence, the only people left dead are the unsaved.)
Judge in Judgment	Christ as King of kings and Lord of lords	Christ as God of the Universe
Basis of Judgment	The treatment of the Jewish remnant during the Tribulation Period manifesting belief in the message of the 144,000 Jewish Evangelists.	The works of those who names were not found written in the Lamb’s book of life manifesting their depravity and God’s vindication before all creation.
Result of Judgment	Some Gentiles will be saved to enter the Millennial Kingdom. Some will be sent to hell to await the Great White Throne for the judgment at the end of time.	No one saved at all. All men in Hell will be cast into the Lake of Fire (Gehenna) where they will suffer for all eternity with degrees of punishment fitting their crimes.
