



### What Does Inspiration Mean?

"Inspiration" refers to the way in which God gave us His Holy Word, the Bible.


Having revealed Himself and His Word to man, God moved to record and preserve this revelation in written form.



#### How God Did Not Send His Word

God could have chosen any number of impressive and remarkable ways to send it:

- He could have spoken from heaven to the World
- He could have sent us an angel with flaming tablets of truth
- He could have craved it on the Alps with lightning
- He could have had it come down from the seat of "St. Peter" in Rome
- He could have had it discovered on "Nephite" plates buried on Cumorah Hill

#### II Peter 1:21


II Peter 1:21 "For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost."

This passage reveals the two key aspects of Inspiration:

- Human Penmanship "Holy Men of God spake"
- 2. Divine Authorship "moved by the Holy Ghost"



### Carried Along by God




What the verse is saying is that God was the active source of the Scriptures. The word "moved" (Greek "pheromenoi"  $\phi \epsilon \rho o \mu \epsilon \nu o \iota$ ) means "carried along" or "borne along" as a leaf is carried in the wind or a log in the swift moving waters of a flood. This indicates that God simply follow the writers along or hover over their shoulders to make sure they did not accidently make a mistake. He did not intervene if He thought that someone was straying from His plan. Rather, the Scripture here indicates that God consciously moved these willing men along. He impressed on their minds, using their style and vocabulary the very words He intended for them to use. And as God's Words filled their hearts and minds as wind filled the sails of a ship, they were carried along to wrote exactly what He intended. (The very same Greek word was used in Acts 27:17 and is translated "driven" signifying that the ship was completely controlled by the wind and was at the total mercy of the storm.)

#### 40 Authors 40 Generations

The inspiration of the Scriptures is a **TOTAL** miracle from God. God used some 40 different authors of widely varying occupations and educational levels over a time span of 40 generations (1,600 years) and gave us a Book that is total agreement with itself and without error. It is truly God's miracle book.



## II Timothy 3:16



"All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness:"

II Timothy 3:16

#### **God Breathed**

Here the key phrase is "given by inspiration". Inspiration is theopnuestos (Greek  $\theta \in \mathcal{OTVU} \in \mathcal{OTOO}$  or "God-breathed".)

What this Scripture is literally saying is that God is the very Author of Divine Revelation and that makes Bible the very Word of the living God!



## Moving Toward a Full Definition of Inspiration



We can say on the basis of these and other Scriptures that inspiration is the moving of the Holy Spirit upon the human writers of the Bible in such a way that they recorded the very words and sense of God, though clearly written in their own vocabulary and literary style.


## But We Need to Add Detail Due to the False Theories of Bible-Rejecting Men:

There are five terms that are crucial to refute man's false ideas:

- 1. Confluent Inspiration
- 2. Verbal Inspiration
- 3. Plenary Inspiration
- 4. Inerrant Inspiration
- 5. Infallible Inspiration Let's examine each term:



### **Confluent Inspiration**



"By the Lord through the prophet" ... This makes it clear that God is working in a special way...Divine and Human involvement and just as inexplicable as the Virgin Birth and the New Birth.

Many Scriptures affirm this... Matthew 1:22, Acts 4:25, Acts 13:35, Isaiah 8:1, Isaiah 30:8 etc.

This view of Inspiration is directly in contradiction of the so called "Mechanical Dictation" Theory, which incorrectly teaches that the writers of Scripture were merely dictating machines through which God simply used to transcribe His Word.

#### Four Writers and Four Gospels

This explains how different writers could have different styles and content in the four Gospels, where the life of Christ is examined from four perspectives.


Matthew ...Christ the King of Israel

Mark ... Christ the Servant of the LORD

Luke...Christ the Perfect Man

John...Christ the God Man





#### Paul Deserves Equal Attention



This also explains the statement of the apostle Paul in I Corinthians 7:12..."to the rest speak I, not the Lord..." Many have interpreted this as Paul saying that some parts of the Epistle were his opinion and others were inspired. But clearly Paul was referring to the fact that some of his instructions where based on previous revelation from the Gospels while in the areas where he did not have specific revelation from the Lord in the Gospels, he was giving new revelation which should be accorded equal attention and respect because he was God's instrument in the penning of Divinely inspired revelation.

### Verbal Inspiration

- By this we mean that the *very words* of Scripture are God's Words
- Inspiration goes beyond the concepts and message to the *actual* words. I Corinthians 2:13; Matthew 24:35; Jeremiah 1:9



#### A BRIEF HEBREW LESSON



- In fact, according to Matthew 5:18, inspiration extends to even the:
  - smallest letter (jot )"yodh") and
  - the smallest parts of Hebrew letters (tittle)



#### THUS SAITH THE LORD

Many Scriptures show the emphasis God places on Words:

#### Plenary Inspiration



The word "plenary" means "extending equally to all parts."

## Practical Implications of Plenary Inspiration

Thus applied to Inspiration it means:

- The Entire Bible is inspired
- Every part of the Bible equally inspired.
   Malachi is just as inspired as Micah or Matthew and Luke has equal standing with Lamentations

















## All Scripture is Inspired!



II Timothy 3:16 reminds us that "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God"...


#### Well Said, Sir!

"The BIBLE is none other than the Voice of Him that sitteth upon the Throne! Every book of it — every chapter of it — every verse of it — every word of it — every syllable of it — (where are we to stop?) every letter of it — is the direct utterance of the Most High! The Bible is none other than the word of God — not some part of it more, some part of it less, but all alike, the utterance of Him, who sitteth upon the Throne — absolute faultless — unerring — supreme." #### **Inerrant Inspiration**

- The word "inerrant" means "not liable to be proven wrong in any way" and "incapable of failing".
- When applied to Scripture it means that the Bible was written down correctly in every detail.
- Hebrews 6:18b; Titus
   1:2c; Numbers 23:19;
   John 10:35



### **Guaranteed Accuracy**





- Such inerrant inspiration maintains that the *exact Divine Message* is given.
- Think of it this way: God's truth is still true. Satan's lies are still lies. Both are accurately recorded but inspiration does not turn the Devil's lies into truth, but it does mean they are accurately recorded.

### The Practical Implications

- One commentator said, "What Scripture says, God says — through human agency and without error."
- One proof of this is seen by comparing Rom. 9:17 and Gal. 3:8 (where the Scripture says) Exodus 9:16 and Genesis 12:1,3 respectively (where the LORD says).



## The Difference Between Inerrancy and Infallibility




- This means that the Bible is without error in its teaching. It is incapable of teaching deception.
  - See Psalm 119:160; John 17:17

The terms "infallible" and "inerrant" are often used interchangeably, but there is a difference.

- Inerrant means without error in its <u>recording</u>.
- Infallible means without error in its teaching.

### The Limits of Infallibility

"Infallibility is obviously restricted to the intended assertions of Scripture understood in an ordinary grammatical exegesis of the text."




## Intelligent Infallibility

Infallibility takes into account such things as the use of poetic or figures of speech, the use of simile, hyperbole, allegory, parable, and symbolism, etc.

Term	Definition	Example
Alliteration	The repetition of usually initial consonant sounds in two or more neighboring words or syllables	The wild and woolly walrus waits and wonders when we'll walk by
Assonance	A resemblance of sound in words or syllables	holy & stony and Fleet feet sweep by sleeping geese
Cliche	A word or phrase that has become overly familiar or commonplace	No pain, no gain
Hyperbole	Big exaggeration, usually with humor	mile-high ice-cream cones

### Infallible Inspiration







In most cases, what is inspired is authoritative, but not in all cases. Some things in the Bible, though accurately recorded through inspiration, do not have the authority of God. The Book of Job accurately records the words of God, Job, Satan, Job's wife, Eliphaz, Bildad, Zophar, and Elihu. Some of the statements in the Book are consequently ungodly or in direct contradiction to the other statements of Scripture. They are inspired, but not authoritative. (Many cults conveniently overlook this very important distinction.)

### Theories of Inspiration

What we have presented is the Bible's clear teaching on inspiration, but not everyone accepts it. Other theories abound. They largely fall into one of three camps which we will survey so you can understand how men go astray from the truth:




## The Position of Conservative but Not Fundamentalist Theology



These ideas weighed in the scales of truth and found sorely wanting.

#### **Statement of Position:**

"The Bible *IS* the Word of God"



#### Mechanical Dictation

**Dynamic Inspiration**: This also known as "Mechanical Dictation". The writers of Scripture were nothing more than passive instruments through which the Word of God flowed and they were utterly insensible to what they wrote. Those who hold to the verbal, plenary inspiration are often accused of this position, but those who make this charge ignore our belief in confluency. It should be noted that there were, in fact, certain occasions where direct dictation did occur. (Rev. 2:1,8,12, 18 etc., Exodus 34:27 – yet even those passage appear to bear the style of the author. (It is important to note that the Bible is not pure dictation...there are very real differences in style, vocabulary, and thought patterns in the Bible. This would not be the case if God was simply dictating the words to the earthly authors.)



#### **Concept Inspiration**



**Conceptual Inspiration** – This is also known as the "thought Inspiration" theory. It holds that the thoughts, concepts, and root message of the Bible were inspired but dismisses the words as utterly unnecessary. This viewpoint says that all versions of the Scripture are good and that really they all basically are saying the same thing. This is the position of A H Strong, the Baptist Theologian and the operating philosophy of the NIV. The problem is that the Bible clearly teaches the doctrine of VERBAL inspiration...ref. to Verbal Inspiration slide. I Corinthians 2:13

#### The Position of Modernist Theology


#### Statement of Position- "The Bible CONTAINS the Word of God."

Partial Inspiration –This theory holds that the Bible is a mixture of the sublime and the ridiculous. Parts of it are inspired but other parts are pure fable. In other words, somewhere between the covers of the Scriptures you will find God's Word. But the problem is that the people holding this view cannot seem to agree about which passages are inspired. Some hold that the great cardinal doctrines are inspired, while supporting arguments and evidences are of purely human origin. Some hold that only those parts of Scripture containing good moral instruction are inspired. The test is often --- is it rational? A theory akin to this one is the Degree Inspiration theory which sees some part of the Bible as more inspired that others (i.e. the Sermon on the Mount is more inspired that the Mosaic Law Code.) Our answer is again that the Bible teaches Plenary Inspiration- (II Timothy 3:16) we have to point out that Partial Inspiration is terribly subjective and creates a new authority apart from the Word of God itself. The question arises naturally, "Just who decides what is inspired and what is not?" Men (especially theologians of the liberal stripe and scholars) set themselves up as judges as to what is God's Word and what is not.



#### **Another Modernist View**





#### **Gracious Inspiration-**

Sometimes called Genius inspiration holds that "spiritfilled" writers from every generation who are holy and pious are "inspired". Thus the writings of Bunyan, Clive Staples Lewis, and even Shakespeare are equally inspired as the words of John, Paul or Moses.


### Final Modernist View -Natural Inspiration


This theory is called "Universal Christian Illumination" – It really says all the Bible writers were inspired just like the writings of all other Christians (and others) in other ages. Really it is like saying the writings of some author are "inspiring".


#### Demythologizing Inspiration




This view teaches that the Bible was written in "legendary language" and it is the work of the modern interpreter to "demythologize" the Bible to cut away the myth so that the truth may emerge.

#### This View Holds:

Take out the "myths" and you will arrive at the "real message of God's selfgiving love in Christ. It is not necessary to hold to an objective, historical and propositional revelation in order to experience this subjective and personal truth." -**Rudolf Bultmann** 



#### An Example of This View




An example of this view is the idea of Theistic Evolution. These people hold that the first two chapters of Genesis are nothing more than pure myth. God is seen as using the forces of evolution to bring about mankind. It is not the process that is important rather it is the fact that God eventually brought about man.

#### Refuting This View

- This whole view makes the Bible SUBJECTIVE.
- Since the Bible must be demythologized, its interpretation depends on MAN.
- Therefore, MAN is the authority and NOT God.
- This runs entirely counter to the REAL teaching of the Word of God!



#### Personal Encounter Inspiration



Bultmann's radical Neo-Orthodox position was too extreme for some so -Emil Brunner, Karl Barth, Paul Tillich and others developed a "gentler" position called Personal **Encounter Inspiration** To them the Bible **BECOMES** the Word of God when you have a personal encounter with it!

#### So What Does PEI Teach?

- They hold the Bible is an imperfect Book
- But as you read it
- God's message "breaks through"
- Thus, Bible truth is personal, subjective, and entirely dependent on the Reader.



#### Their Own Words



In this view, what you bring to the study of the Bible determines the truth of the Bible. You see what you wish to in it like this kitten looking in the mirror!

- The Bible is "original translation of Christian feeling" Schleiermacher
- "Receptive and Creative response to potentially revelatory facts." Tillich
- "An encounter with a hidden God" Barth
- "Not propositional (in words) but personal (through words)" Brunner


#### Big Problems With This View




- Makes reading the Bible mystical and emotive.
- Makes man the authority not the Bible.
- This is Christ of the imagination and not reality!
- With this view anything goes, cannot distinguish between Truth and Illusion!

#### The Inspiration of the Old Testament

The Doctrine of the Inspiration of Scripture does not rest on one or two "proof-texts" (although that would be sufficient)! Rather it is a truth found throughout the Scripture –by direct statements or evidenced throughout the text.



### The Writers of the Old Testament Were Prophets

- A prophet was, above all, a mouthpiece for God, in spite of whatever else he was in life.
- Deuteronomy 18:18-22 shows that true prophets could only speak as God gave them His Words.



#### Deuteronomy 8:18-22



- "18 I will raise them up a Prophet from among their brethren, like unto thee, and will put my words in his mouth; and he shall speak unto them all that I shall command him.
- 19 And it shall come to pass, that whosoever will not hearken unto my words which he shall speak in my name, I will require it of him.
- 20 But the prophet, which shall presume to speak a word in my name, which I have not commanded him to speak, or that shall speak in the name of other gods, even that prophet shall die.
- 21 And if thou say in thine heart, How shall we know the word which the LORD hath not spoken?
- 22 When a prophet speaketh in the name of the LORD, if the thing follow not, nor come to pass, that is the thing which the LORD hath not spoken, but the prophet hath spoken it presumptuously: thou shalt not be afraid of him."

### Old Testament Writers Quoted Other Old Testament Books




- Joshua studied the LAW of God (Pentauech)
- Ezra referred to Jeremiah as "the word of the LORD"
- Ezra acknowledged the prophecies of Haggai and Zechariah
- Daniel accepted Jeremiah and the Torah as the Word of God. Note also he accepted the Book of Judges
- Zechariah alludes to the Former Prophets (The Historical Books)

## The Old Testament Books Were Reverenced by Israel

- The Tables of the Law were kept in the Ark of the Covenant
- 2. The Books of Moses were commanded to be read
- 3. Samuel's writings were kept in the Tabernacle
- 4. Israel stood in reverence at the reading of the LAW



The New Testament is filled with quotations from the Old Testament, extolls the Old Testament as the Word of God, and accepts the Old Testament account as accurate and authoritative. There are 332 direct quotations and references to the Old Testament in the New Testament, and well over 1,000 partial quotes, paraphrases and allusions to the Old Testament in the New Testament.


#### Theology – The Doctrine of God

#### Anthropology – The Doctrine of Man

The Bible pictures man as base, vile, wicked, sinful, corrupt, and depraved. Even the hideous sins of David, God's man, are given. This is NOT the picture man has of himself nor would we have written it!



#### Hamartiology – The Doctrine of Sin



Natural man minimizes, ignores, denies, or exalts SIN. The Bible does the opposite! That the natural man hates and denies hell clearly makes the Bible a book man **WOULD NOT write.**





### The Credibility of the Scripture



The Credibility of the Bible has to do with the TRUTHFULNESS of its narrative or its inerrancy.

Psalm 119:160 "Thy word is true from the beginning: and every one of thy righteous judgments endureth for ever."

#### Making the Case to Unbelievers

We hold the Bible true!

But unbelievers need proof!

The Question: Is the Bible trustworthy?

The Test: Compare the Bible with KNOWN facts!

The Bible does not claim to be a science textbook, although it is full scientific truth. What is important to note is that what the Bible taught was contrary to established beliefs of its day and in total agreement with what know we now is scientifically true!

#### Just Quick Look at the DNA

#### DNA is the "blueprint" of life.

- If all the DNA in your body was put end to end, it would reach to the sun and back over 600 times (100 trillion times six feet divided by 92 million miles).
- It would take a person typing 60 words per minute, eight hours a day, around 50 years to type the human genome.
- If all three billion letters in the human genome were stacked one millimeter apart, they would reach a height 7,000 times the height of the Empire State Building.
- If unwound and tied together, the strands of DNA in one cell would stretch almost six feet but would be only 50 trillionths of an inch wide.
- There's an estimated 3 billion DNA bases in our genome.
- One million bases (called a megabase and abbreviated Mb) of DNA sequence data is roughly equivalent to 1 megabyte of computer data storage space.


### The Archaeological Trustworthiness of the Bible





- The tablets even list the cities in the Biblical order!


#### Geographical Trustworthiness

**Genesis 10 is clearly** confirmed in the outward movement of humanity after the flood. Archaeology has confirmed the civilization Abram left in Ur and the picture of Egypt laid out in Moses' writings. It all fits!

Archaeology has confirmed many important details concerning chronological events detailed in the Bible such as the census of Caesar Augustus, the procedures for it, and the other leaders cited in the Nativity story.
